PROSECCO HILLS

The Prosecco Hills are one of the most loved and particular cycling destinations in the whole Italian territory. With our bicycle we will pass through the vineyards that give rise to the renowned Prosecco D.O.C.G. From Conegliano to Refrontolo passing through the most beautiful villages in Italy such as Follina and Cison di Valmareno.

The Prosecco Hills of Conegliano and Valdobbiadene are a viticultural landscape resulting from the interaction of nature and people over the course of several centuries. The adaptation and transformation of the challenging terrain of the geomorphology of the ridges required the development of specific land

use practices, including: the management of the vineyard by hand on steep slopes; the grassy terraces known as ciglioni, which follow the contours of the landscape, stabilizing the land and the vineyards; and the "bellussera" training system that was developed in the area around 1880. As a result, the vineyards help to shape a distinctive "chessboard" appearance, with perpendicular rows of tall vines, interspersed with rural settlements, forests and small woods. Despite many changes, the history of sharecropping in this area is also reflected in the landscape. A fantastic prosecco bike tour is the best way to discover this UNESCO territory.



WHEN TO GO?



When to go? Each season holds delicious surprises, providing all the senses with ever-renewed satisfaction. We recommend moving from April until the end of October. From the first blooms of spring, to the intense green of the rows in summer, while in autumn the hills are painted red giving life to a wonderful foliage.

GOLF



The Asolo Golf Club is one of the most beautiful golf courses in Veneto. Immersed in the green hills of Asolo, the Asolo Golf Club consists of 27 holes divided into 3 courses: yellow, green and red. To the east of the Golf we find the area of the Prosecco Hills, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. A suggestive landscape made up of green hills formed by rows that cover the surface. In addition to a golf stay you will have the opportunity to get in touch with the territory with a Prosecco DOCG tasting accompanied by typical local products.

One hour away from golf is one of the most beautiful cities in the world: Venice. You will find Palaces, museums, streets and fields. All to be admired and known, as well as being a city where you can indulge in exclusive shopping. Just a few kilometers from Golf, on the other hand, there is Possagno, home of Canova, where you can admire its temple and the Gipsoteca. 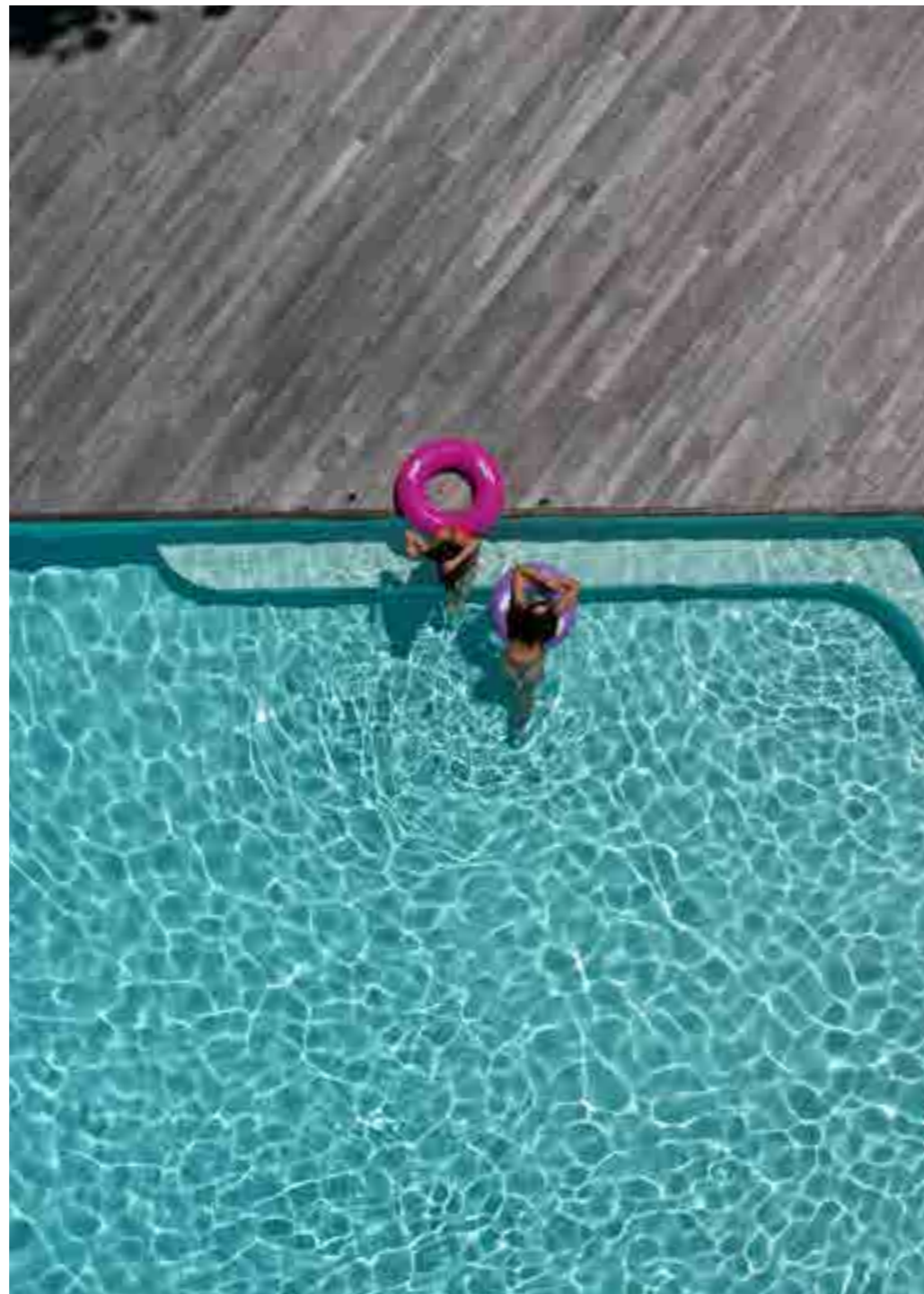

HOTEL VILLA SOLIGO



Villa Soligo is a neoclassical structure in the Palladian style, built in 1782 by the Counts Brandolini d'Adda. It was originally used by the noble family as a summer residence and hunting lodge. The building has witnessed several events in Italian history; it was damaged in WWI and in 1942, during WWII, German armed forces used it as a headquarters. The celebrities who have stayed at Hotel Villa Soligo include Marcello Mastroianni, Alberto Sordi and Sofia Loren. Partially renovated in 1945 and 1980, in 2020 Hotel Villa Soligo, with almost 240 years of history, was completely renovated and re-structured. The Palladian structure was turned into a concept hotel designed to excite the world's travellers with new emotions.

The restaurant "Da Gigetto" is located in Miane in the heart of the Prosecco Hills. A place that was born at the beginning of the twentieth century and that has undergone a natural evolution and gastronomic innovation over the years, always following the seasonality of the products.

Inside the restaurant we find an extraordinary cellar in the basement, which can be accessed via a tunnel dug into the rock, and where wines from all over the world rest around a well with 18-meter deep surging water. Currently there are about 1,800 labels including wines, whiskey and rum on our wine list.



DID YOU KNOW?

At first, the place was an "old post house", where horses were housed and fed in the nearby stable before continuing their journey, and travelers found a place to rest and eat frugal meals in the inn.

Venice

If the desire is to get to know the area in a different way and away from the tourist crowds, you can venture out on a tour of the Venice lagoon, enjoying not only nature and its enchanting landscapes, but also culture and the discovery of forgotten traditions.

The Venetian lagoon is the largest in Italy: it includes the mainland (with the city of Venice and more than fifty other smaller islands) and the "aquatic" part, with its numerous canals, sandbanks and shoreline areas. Connected to the Adriatic Sea by three inlets: San Nicolò (north of Lido di Venezia), Malamocco (south of Lido) and Chioggia.

In 1987, it was declared a Unesco World Heritage Site – all the more reason to set sail for the magnificent islands.

The island of Venice Lido, which is easily reached from Venice, Chioggia or Cavallino/Treporti, is in a privileged position to start a tour of the lagoon.

To begin with, the Lido is the starting point for discovering the lagoon.

Starting from the north, we reach the area of San Nicolò, with its nature oasis, Benedictine Church and Monastery, and one of the oldest Jewish Cemeteries in Europe.

Then it's on to the centre, with its Art Nouveau villas and historic hotels, and the glamorous places where the Film Festival is held every year. We then move south to visit the ancient village of Malamocco (a miniature Venice where the cartoonist Hugo Pratt was based) and finally arrive at Alberoni, the most southerly area, where we can enjoy another natural oasis with one of the best-preserved dune systems

in the Adriatic.

If the northern lagoon is best known for Murano, Burano and Torcello, from the Lido it is easy to get to other lesser-known but equally surprising jewels.

Starting from the Lido, you can also discover the island of Certosa, to enjoy the most incredible views of the lagoon, or the Vignole, a small town famous for its vegetable gardens and its trattorias, or walk along Sant'Andrea to admire the remains of its 16th-century fortress (which cannot be visited today). But also worth a visit is Sant'Erasmo, the largest island in the northern lagoon, known as the vegetable garden of the Serenissima, known for its Slow Food Presidium artichokes and wines, or San Francesco del deserto, a small place of peace where one can retreat to meditate and relax in the silence of the lagoon.



WHEN TO GO?

GOLF

The Venetian Golf Club can rightfully claim the title of eldest club in the region and among the oldest ones in Italy. Its foundation and opening date as far back as 1928 and 1930, respectively, with an entire week of competitions and celebrations organized by its first 25 members belonging to the noble families of the Venetian aristocracy.

The legend has it that it was a small incident occurred during the visit of Henry Ford – President of Ford Motor Company – to originate the idea of creating a golf course on the Venice Lido. Disembarking at the Hotel Excelsior in 1928 with its bag and clubs, Mr. Ford asked his friend Count Giuseppe Volpi di Misurata to try himself out playing at the nearest links. Regretfully, his host had to reply that there were no golf



links in Venice and set out never to embarrass himself like that again in his life, although this sport was almost unheard of in Italy at the time. Count Volpi di Misurata, then shareholder and President of CIGA, the Italian Company of Grand Hotels, immediately started to search for a suitable area where to design a course abreast with the elegant architecture and facilities already existing on the island. He identified an area of 100 hectares at Alberoni, the southern end of the Lido – near Malamocco harbour's mouth, whose natural features – windy and characterized by a sandy soil – were up to the standards of the best British traditions. Under the lead of Scottish architect Cruikshank of Maxwell M. Hart of Glasgow, the works begun in 1928, around an old Austrian fortification built for the defense of Venice, army quarters and horse stables – that make up the skeleton of today's Club House. The architect designed the first 9 holes, finally providing Venice with an intriguing PAR 35 course.

Influential personalities, such as Hitler and Mussolini, the Duke of Windsor and Henry Cottons played on the Lido's greens.

After World War II, the need to enlarge the course was felt and based on architect C.K. Cotton's design, 9 holes were added to attain a challenging PAR 72, playable from 1951. During the years, the Circolo Golf Venezia has hosted countless high-level tournaments – from the Italian Open in 1955, 1960 and 1974, to the Usa-Europe match in 1978, the Vagliano Trophy in 1989 and 2001, to the four editions of the Italian Seniors Open in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007 as well as a number of CIRCOLO GOLF VENEZIA individual, foursome and team Italian Championships. Last, but by no means least, the most prestigious tournament of the Venetian competitive season, the much coveted "Leone di San Marco", contended each year by the best national amateurs since 1953

BIKE

The Venice islands cycle route is a path that runs between the islands of Lido and Pellestrina, which lie between the lagoon and the Adriatic Sea, the most enjoyable way, by bike, to visit these two unique places in the Venetian lagoon.

To begin our cycling tour of the Lido, we set off from the north. Pedalling along the length of the lagoon, you begin in the San Nicolò area, with its Benedictine Church and Monastery and the Jewish

Cemetery, as well as an oasis of protected nature and, on the other side, the lighthouse, a perfect spot to take a few photos of the Adriatic Sea.

However, if you enter the central area of the Lido, taking the Gran Viale Santa Maria Elisabetta you can go in search of the Lido's Art Nouveau past: first you can admire the distinctive Grande Albergo Ausonia Hungaria, and continue by discovering the numerous villas built in the early 20th century in



Venetian Art Nouveau style.

Going the other way, towards the sea, you arrive at the Lungomare Marconi, passing the iconic Hotel Des Bains and the landmarks of the International Film Festival, held every late summer on the Lido di Venezia. First, the Palazzo del Casinò, then the Palazzo del Cinema and finally the majestic Hotel Excelsior, the most luxurious hotel on the island still in operation today.

Heading back along the lagoon, cycling along Via Sandro Gallo (the longest street on the Lido, which

runs through almost the entire island), you can stop for a break in the delightful village of Malamocco, a small Venice with alleys, courtyards and canals.

Carrying on southwards, you finally reach the Alberoni area, following a stretch of cycle path along the Murazzi fortresses, the final great work of the Serenissima built to protect the island from the rage of the sea. Another nature reserve can be found here, and lastly, you can catch the Ferry Boat towards Pellestrina.



HOTEL

The history of Ausonia Hungaria palace is interwoven with that of Venice's Lido island, as the favorite destination of many visitors, often well-known.

From the late 1800s and into the early 1900s, Lido island enjoyed unprecedented growth in tourism due mainly to the new fashion of 'bathing at the seaside'.

The building became iconic and distinctive from 1913, when the ceramist Luigi Fabris created the particular decoration of the main façade in multi-colored majolica tiles, thus giving the island a unique Liberty-style building.

Motifs of ochre and water-green vegetables, fruit and flower garlands, puttos and female figures symbolizing Venice and Hungary, merge to create the charming combination of forms and colors we still admire, in a complex balance between innovation and experimentation.

VENETIAN WEAVING

The first fine fabrics produced in Venice were silk, enriched with precious gold and silver yarns. This is the Auroseric weaving, the construction technique of which was revealed to the Serenissima thanks to the love of an emperor for a Venetian noblewoman. You will be able to discover the current production in an ancient weaving factory where looms from the 1700s are still used today

with jewelled handle. The designer receives visitors in her atelier in the historic centre of Venice, a space with the timeless atmosphere amidst the narrow streets of the Dorsoduro district, the "Museum Mile" of the city. The new shop is opening a few steps by the Peggy Guggenheim Collection, in Calle Chiesa 683.



DIEGO VIO

Diego was born in Murano. He began his apprenticeship in Murano's furnaces at a very young age and "steal with the eye" became the motto for learning the techniques. At the age of 19 Diego had already become a "maestro de piassa" at Barovier&Toso where he learned this centuries old art. Heart, determination and passion transform matter into timeless objects with impeccable manual skills.



LA FORNACE

Since 1991, in the heart of Murano, a nineteenth century industrial building houses the furnace Antica Murano.

When you step into the furnace, you enter in another dimension, where seeing the glass master with his assistants working, makes you fascinated. It seems like matter is transformed with bare hands, with simplicity and awareness of what needs to be done.

With ancient gestures, the glass master and his assistants shape matter, sand and fire from white hot liquid to a real object to the point of creating a unique and original piece.

Furnace, the place where space becomes stage and visitors become spectators.

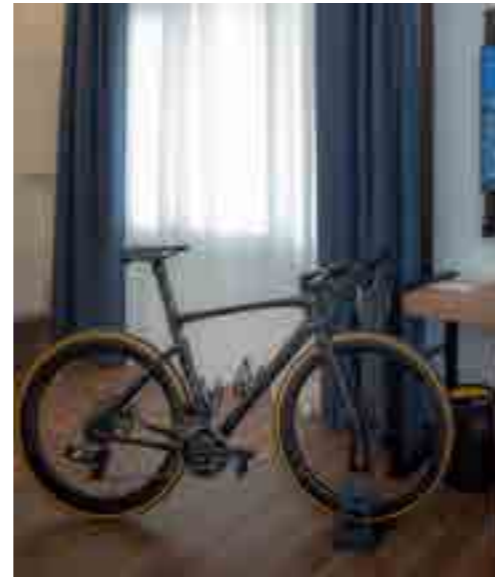

Padua and Euganean Hills

In the middle of the Venetian plain, spreading unceasingly through fields and slow rivers, **suddenly, lush peaks rise gently from the flat countryside. These are the Euganean Hills**, a group of around hundred verdant hills that modifies the even landscape with forests, picturesque villages and sweeping vineyards. The destination offers a great deal of holiday possibilities throughout the year.

However, **one of the best time to experience the place is during autumn, when the panorama of the hills turns into an impressionistic canvas.** The trees dye of all the nuances of red and yellows, the terrain covers in leaves and spiky shells of chestnuts and the weather, chilly and crisp, enhances the steam of the thermal waters, creating mysterious atmospheres.

Located just outside Padua city centre, this area represents one of the biggest natural parks of Veneto region: the so called "Parco Regionale dei Colli Euganei". The park develops in a circular shape, it is 18,694 hectares broad and spreads within 15 municipalities. Nature wise, it embraces an interesting variety of plant life; there are rugged terrains, chestnut and oak forests but also more Mediterranean landscapes, such as carpets of prickly pears, shrub vegetation and ultimately, the characteristic grape plantations. But this is not just it! The Euganean Hills are even more: medieval hamlets scattering around the foothills and oasis of wellness with spilling hot waters. This is the paradise for bike lovers with numerous cycling routes and also for golf lovers with the magnificent Golf Club Padua.

The first golf course in Padua was born in 1962 on the initiative of the industrialist Iginio Kofler and a group of passionate golfers with the name of Euganeo Golf Club. The course now includes 27 holes located at the foot of the Euganean Hills, bordering the seventeenth-century Villa Barbarigo. Designed by the English architect John Harris of the Cotton studio in London, the first 18 holes par 72 transmit technical and landscape harmony thanks also to the precious contribution made by another historic president of the club: Benedetto Sgaravatti.

The field is a veritable botanical garden with 8000 trees and bushes chosen according to landscape and technical criteria, thus revealing a unique path that winds through stretches of water and strategically distributed sand obstacles.

The Padova Golf Club offers accommodation facilities such as swimming pool, sauna and gym and the restaurant well known in the region and in the national golf scene deserves a mention. Golf Club Padua is the first Golf in Italy to offer a bike rent service.





BIKE

From the Euganean Hills there are numerous cycling routes, which offer the opportunity to immerse yourself in a splendid landscape made up of green hills of volcanic origin, clear waterways and enchanting historic villages. From the ring-shaped cycle path of the Euganean Hills, to the Via del Sale e dello Zuccherò, up to the itinerary of the Walled Cities. THERMAE

The Euganean Spas of Abano and Montegrotto are the largest spa in Europe specializing in mud-bath therapy and spa treatments. PRAGLIA ABBEY

The Praglia Abbey stands at the foot of the Euganean hills, about 12 kilometers from Padua, along the ancient road that led to Este. Founded between the 11th and 12th centuries, it remained a dependency of the Abbey of S. Benedetto in Polirone in Mantua until 1304. Only at the beginning of the 14th century did the community of Praglia, rooted more firmly in the Paduan territory, fully autonomous by electing an Abbot chosen from among the ranks of its monks. In 1448 Praglia joined the Reform of Santa Giustina di Padova, a choice that sanctioned his spiritual, cultural and material "second birth".

SCROVEGNI CHAPEL

The Chapel, dedicated to the Virgin of the Annunciation, in suffrage of the soul of Reginaldo Scrovegni, Enrico's father, placed in the Divine Comedy by Dante Alighieri in Hell as a usurer, is presented as a single room ending at the bottom with a presbytery that houses the sarcophagus of the client. A simple architecture, perhaps by Giotto himself, made up of tall, narrow windows and a Gothic mulioned window on the facade.



To adorn the chapel, the client was entrusted with the task of creating three marble altar statues depicting the Madonna and Child between two deacons, and Giotto with the cycle of frescoes. The great painter at the time was in Padua at the invitation of the Friars Minor to embellish the Basilica of S. Antonio but was already famous for having frescoed the Basilica of S. Francesco in Assisi and that of S. Giovanni in Laterano in Rome, as well as that the famous Palazzo della Ragione in Padua, another masterpiece of the art of the fourteenth century.

Architettura e ville venete: The area of the Berici Hills is enriched by numerous historic villas, many of which date back to the period of the Venetian Republic. These villas, often surrounded by lush gardens and vineyards, bear witness to the wealth and prestige of the Venetian nobility who resided in the region.

Sentiero degli Eroi: The Berici Hills are crossed by the "Path of the Heroes," a hiking trail that connects various historical sites related to World War I. This trail offers breathtaking panoramic views of the surrounding countryside and allows visitors to immerse themselves in the history and nature of the region.



WHEN TO GO?

In the Berici Hills of Vicenza there is a particular climatic difference with the surrounding plain: on the southern side it is possible to find Mediterranean-type vegetation, while in the other areas, intense greenery and high rocky walls alternate. The ideal period to discover the area and nature is from March to October. The highest peak of the hills is 445 m. and the temperature in July and August is more pleasant. The best season to enjoy sports and culture in Verona is from March to November Verona: a UNESCO world heritage city and the home of Romeo and Juliet, a place of history, culture, music, architecture and high society. A land of great traditions, from opera to fine food and wine.

TIPS



Verona's Capitulare Library is the oldest, still running library existing in the world. It preserves a heritage of inestimable value: over 1200 ancient manuscripts, 268 incunabula and 11 thousand parchments have been preserved here for about 1600 years. In confirmation of its primacy, we mention the famous Ursicino Code, dated 1 August 517 AD, which hands down the existence of a scriptorium that was already active in the previous century.

VILLA PISANI

The Barchessa is located within the prestigious historical Villa Pisani. The Villa was designed by the Architect Andrea Palladio in the XVI century and is included in the UNESCO World Heritage Site "City of Vicenza and the Palladian Villas of the Veneto"

Villa Pisani Bonetti in Bagnolo di Lonigo is set in the part of the Vicenza countryside that still has very strong



ties with the agricultural system that represented the fulcrum of a profitable agricultural business which was able to interact with the surrounding territory.

Over the years, numerous and significant renovation works have restored the original clean and rigorous architectural spaces, now used to host important events aimed at the promotion of contemporary art, which leaves its visible sign here, thanks to a permanent collection.

Created as a country house for the Pisani family, nobles from Venice, the Villa stands close to the Gua River, The Vila Pisani contains the monumental and distinctive building "Barchessa", originally a farm building featuring large arched porticoes. Initially used for agricultural purposes, it comes back to life in the 21st century after careful restoration and complete renovation.

Today, the preserved and enhanced "Barchessa" serves as a hotel, restaurant and event location.

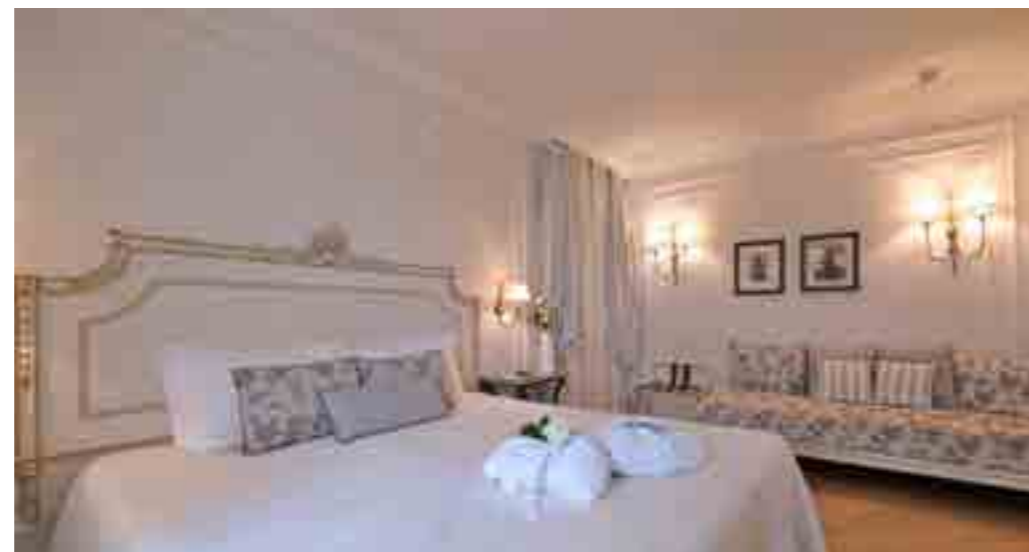

Modena and Castles

An overview of the castles, fortresses and towers that give Terre di Castelli its name: bulwarks of a turbulent past, made up of disputes and power-struggles between families, but also of art and beauty. With a pretty good view of the Modena hills.

If we think of suggestive places, dotted with castles immersed in green landscapes, our thoughts immediately turn to distant places: Scotland, Bavaria, the Loire. But also in Italy there are some fine examples. The hills around Modena, eight municipalities that stretch to the heart of the Apennines: Castelnovo Rangone, Spilamberto, Vignola, Savignano sul Panaro, Castelvetro di Modena, Guiglia, Marano, Zocca are one such example. Not by chance these territories are known as the **Terre di Castelli**.

Often the places full of fortresses and castles have troubled histories, family disputes, tribal wars, borders to defend and constant threats. The Terre di Castelli around Modena are no exception. The fortresses built here, **well-preserved** to this today, were initially fortifications for military use. Erected in **strategic positions** to maintain control of the territory in the medieval period and resist the continual struggle for power between local seigniories. What was once a strategic military location today offers us breathtaking **panoramic views** of the surrounding landscapes.

The territory then became part of the **Este domain**, which chose Ferrara for its first capital city and, from the end of the 1500s, Modena. The Estensi, like many other rulers, entrust the direct rule over lands far

from the capital to less noble loyal families who settle in the existing medieval fortresses in the territory south of Modena, between the hills and the river Panaro - often not without difficulty! The families change the fortresses and make them **elegant, though mighty, residences**.

Terre di Castelli gastronomy is a richness to be tasted. From the Traditional Balsamic Vinegar to blackberry cherry, from the DOC wines to mountain borlenghi, typical products of our territory are preceded by their fame.

The opportunities, the moments, the places to taste them are not lacking: it is enough to travel at a slow pace and stop in the numerous territory farmhouses, wine bars, restaurants or festivals.



WHEN TO GO?



The best months for good weather in Modena are April, May, June, July, August, September and October. On average, the warmest months are July and August while January is the coldest month of the year. The rainiest months are May and June.

GOLF

Born on the initiative of a group of local entrepreneurs, in September 1987, the Modena Golf & Country Club owes its design to the German champion Bernhard Langer, in collaboration with the American architect Jim Engh.

Laying 100 meters above sea level, on an extension of over one hundred hectares, our golf course is among the best in Italy, due to its construction characteristics.

Wide greens, a variety of tee boxes, multiple fairway slopes and 5 artificial lakes all within the typical landscape of Modena's hills. Shaped among oaks, maples and evergreen shrubs, our course is an ideal spot for both amateur and professional events, ranging from prestigious junior tournaments to the 50th edition of the Open d'Italia sanctioned by the European Tour.



The 9-hole executive course, large driving range with indoor simulator, 2 tennis courts, gym and swimming pool are facilities available within the club.

In the Club House, in addition to the bar-restaurant, there are several spaces for social life. Plenty of rooms for playing cards and ping pong, as well as a TV area, billiard room and a wellness area in each locker room. All these features next to the 15th century tower and the oratory, Casa De Lame, which dates back to the 16th century and is decorated with rhombuses, a classic feature from buildings belonging to the Aggazzotti family.

Additionally, Ca' Bruciate di Sotto and di Sopra which border the "Laghetto Vecchi" residence and "La Tegagna", once a post office, whose elegant lines are engraved in the symbol of the Club.



BIKE

Modena is full of opportunities for those who want to experience the area by bike.

Its physical diversity, with plains, hills and mountains, makes it suitable for the abilities and characteristics of all cyclists, from those who wish to pedal with ease through the flat countryside, to those who prefer to test themselves in more challenging routes on mountain bike up and down the slopes and crests of the Apennines, and all the possibilities inbetween.

Modena also has some special features that make it one of the most interesting provinces for cycle touring. Protected cycle paths have in fact been created along some stretches of the former railway, like the Modena-Vignola line and the Modena-Mirandola-Finale Emilia line, for a total of 60 kilometres. Cycle and walk paths have also been created along the main waterways (Panaro, Secchia and Tiepido), for a total of 120 kilometres.

These routes, almost all complete with signage, together with minor roads and other cycle lanes, mean countless circuit itineraries of different lengths can be enjoyed, to the most interesting places, far way from heavy traffic.

Standing out among these are Romanesque Modena by bike circuits between the city (with the UNESCO world heritage site that includes the Cathedral, Ghirlandina Belltower and Piazza Grande) and Carpi; Riverside Cycling, with routes along the banks of the Secchia and Panaro, between Modena and the south of the province, and the circuit, which on the cycle lane on the former Modena-Vignola railway line links Via Emilia to the hills of Modena through the lands of balsamic vinegar, as far as the cherry valley and the hills of Grasparossa vines.

The province of Modena is also located along long-distance itineraries including the EuroVelo 7 (Sun Route), the European route that goes from the North Pole to Malta, through Europe and Italy, from north to south. Modena is part of the Verona-Florence stretch of this route, which offers



a variety of terrain and a unique wealth of landscape and places: from a geographical and scenic viewpoint (Prealps, Lake Garda, Morainic hills, the Adige, Mincio, Po, Secchia, Panaro and Arno rivers,

Po valley, Apennine hills and mountains), from a cultural point of view with art cities and UNESCO world heritage sites (Verona, Mantua, Modena and Florence) not forgetting that it allows you to disco-

ver the food and wines of the four regions: Veneto, Lombardy, Emilia-Romagna and Tuscany

Rimini and Valmarecchia



Valmarecchia is an ancient valley in the Rimini countryside whose history has been lost in the mists of time. Once a cradle of the ancient Villanovan civilisation (head to **Verucchio** museum to learn more), it was colonised by the Romans, whose ruins and traditions are dotted throughout the area. In fact, legend has it that a majestic Roman temple dedicated to the god Jupiter once stood on Monte Giove di **Santarcangelo** and that vineyards lined its slopes for as far as the eye could see. It was on this hillside that a delicious ruby red wine was produced and named "Sanguis Jovis" (blood of Jupiter), and later, Sangiovese, (i.e., Romagna's best wine!).

However, there is no doubt that **Valmarecchia's golden age** occurred between the **Middle Ages** and the Renaissance era. In fact, during this time, the valley was populated by a dense chessboard of fortresses and fortified villages and became the spectacular setting of the eternal feud between the lords of **Malatesta** and **Montefeltro** (i.e., the never-ending power struggle between Federico and Sigismondo). Thanks to these events, the valley is still home to a historical heritage of exceptional and rare beauty. Just think of the imposing **fortress of Verucchio** (where the Malatesta dynasty began), the **dreamy setting of Sant'Agata Feltria**, the splendid and mysterious **castle of Montebello**, and the charming **fortress of San Leo**.

A tour of this valley deserves a stop-off at a few characteristic town squares to indulge in a spot of relaxation and some local delicacies at a rustic restaurant with a good glass of good wine in hand. Here, you can learn about and listen to local music from **Pennabilli** (Tonino Guerra's birthplace) and Santarcangelo, which travels through the entire valley.



WHEN TO GO?

Each season holds delicious surprises, providing all the senses with ever-renewed satisfaction. We recommend moving from April until the end of October while July and August are high season months caused by seaside tourism.



TIPS

Did you know that Ezra Pound came to Rimini to study the Malatesta Temple and the figure of Sigismondo Malatesta in depth? Ezra wrote of Sigismondo as: "the best loser in history".

CHEESE TASTING

Matera and Metaponto

Narrow lanes, alleys and stairways winding through the cave districts, arches and galleries, large terraces, bell towers and rock churches form the ancient inhabited centre of Matera, the 2019 European Capital of Culture, also known as 'Città dei Sassi' (City of Stone).

Two natural amphitheatres entirely carved out of the rock: the 'Sasso Barisano', to the north-west, and the 'Sasso Caveoso', to the south. The 'Civita' district, which is the oldest inhabited group of buildings, dominates on the 'Sassi di Matera', a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1993. A unique magic that, over time, has achieved the fame of an extraordinary natural film set, where, especially at sunset, you will feel part of a nativity scene, full of meaning.

Pure and authentic scenery with no signs of modernity, the Murgia Materana and the Sassi have seen traces of man since prehistoric times and bear witness to the history of humanity, having been continuously inhabited.

The history of Matera begins in distant times, ranging from prehistoric times to the various metal ages up to the advent of Christianity. Matera is considered one of the oldest cities in the world as into the Gravine Materane several objects dating back to Paleolithic age have been found.

The discoveries by Domenico Ridola, a doctor with a passion for archeology, founder of the National Archaeological Museum of Matera, highly accredit the human presence since the Paleolithic. Evident traces of villages dating back to the Neolithic, on the Murgia Timone, Murgecchia, Serra d'Alto and on the Civita hill suggest in that period the settlements became more stable. After going through the phases of prehistory, including the different metal ages, Christianity characterized the history of Matera. Small monastic communities emigrated following Iconoclasm from Cappadocia, Armenia, Asia Minor and Syria. They took refuge in the already existing caves, they built others and used them as homes and places of prayer. Thus the splendid Rock Churches were born, precious treasures of art and culture.



WHEN TO GO?



The best months for a trip to Basilicata are those between April and September which are months characterized by mild temperatures and less rainfall. The months from June to September are the best for bathing holidays along the coasts of Basilicata.

Besides, these tracks have been set in such a way as to pass through the protected areas, the cultural, natural and historical centres of the region – from the Vulture Melfese to the Murgia Materana, from the Gallipoli Cognato and Small Lucanian Dolomites Park to Potenza, up to the Val D'Agri Park and Maratea. Most of the itineraries start from, arrive at or pass through railway stations or bus stations; actually, all the tracks meant for cyclists using their racing or hybrid bicycle start from there. The majority of the tracks cross low traffic roads such as county roads or B roads where you can barely meet anyone. There is nothing better than cycling far from smog soaking up stunning sceneries. 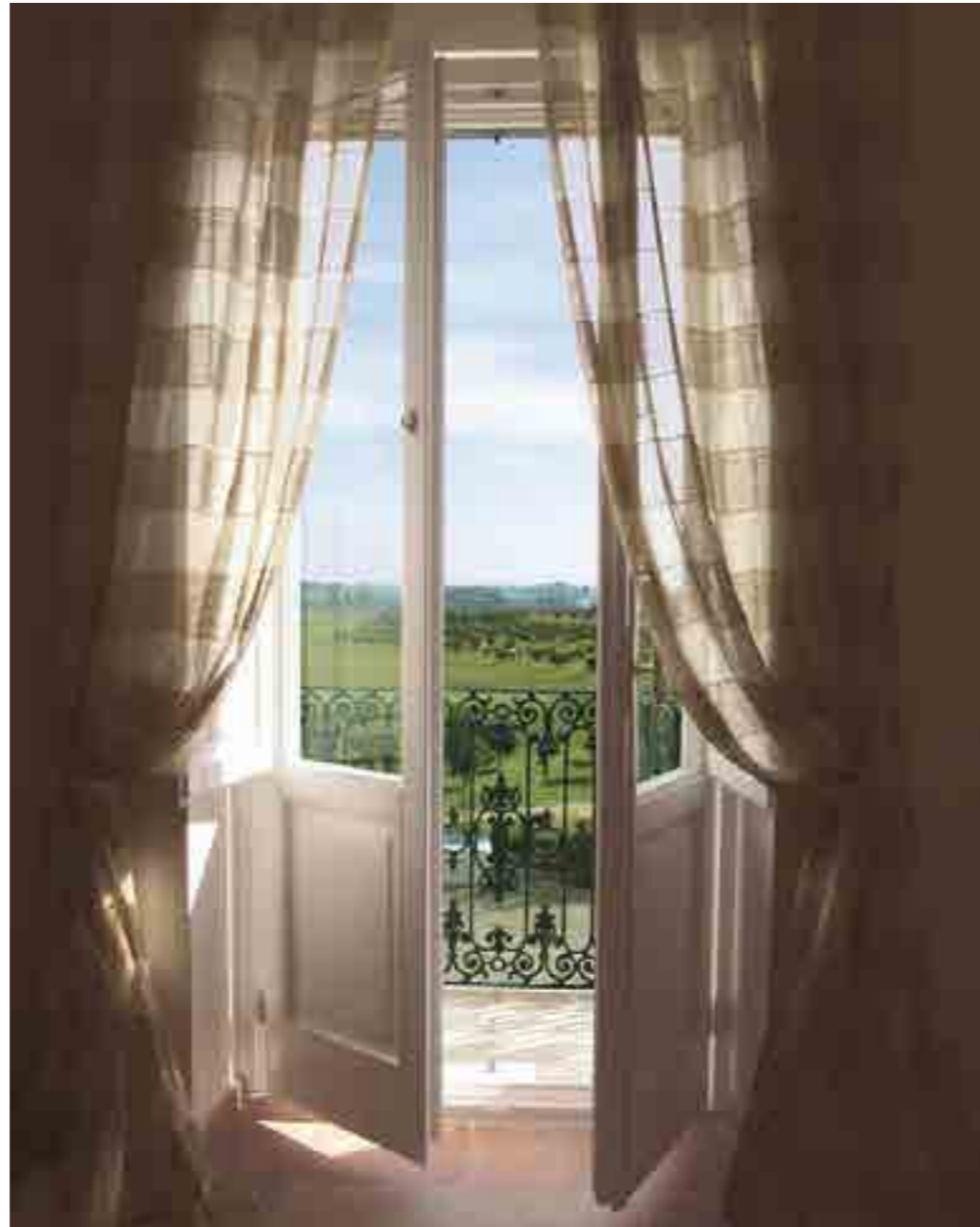

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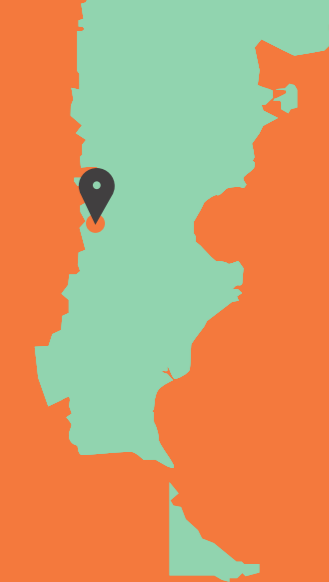
